## On-line session on Use of Technology in livestock (CVT – UTL) - 5<sup>th</sup> August, 2020



Over 70% of rural households in India depend upon agriculture and allied sectors, which include agriculture, horticulture, livestock, forestry and fishery. In 2014-15, agriculture and allied sectors contributed 17.4 per cent to India's Gross Value Added (GVA) at 2011-12 prices, of which the share of crops, livestock, forestry and fishing were 10.9%, 4.4%, 1.2% and 0.9% respectively. India is one among the countries in the world with a very large cattle population.

The Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries (DADF), Government of India, in its Annual Report for the year 2015-16, highlights that animal husbandry is supporting the livelihood of more than two-third of the rural population which owns about 87.7% of the livestock. The total yield that an animal can generate to the farmer is very large and diverse, by way of nutrient rich food products, draught power, organic manure and domestic fuel, bones, hides and skin. Thus, it also provides stability to family income especially in the arid and semi-arid regions of the country. The formation of the new Ministry of Dairy and Animal Husbandry with the GOI has further increased the scope of Animal and Livestock insurance manifold. There are issues, challenges and use of technology apart from knowing the basics of cattle insurance.

COI has created '**Virtual Training (CVT) Rooms**' as a cost-effective mechanism for participants to equip themselves academically at their respective locations.

The sessions would cover the following areas:

- ✚ Basics of cattle and livestock insurance
- ✚ Challenges faced in use of technology
- ✚ Marketing and claim settlement
